East Bridgford Village Hall improvements underway

East Bridgford Village Hall in Nottinghamshire has secured a £2,754 grant from Biffa Award; a

multi-million pound fund that helps to build communities and transform lives through awarding

grants to community and environmental projects across the UK, as part of the Landfill

Communities Fund.

The project, which was awarded funding under Biffa Award's Community Buildings theme, will

re-felt the flat roof on the front extension of the hall, following recent deterioration. Once the

Whilst the project will be delivered by professionals, local volunteers will help treat and paint

water stains on the interior ceiling.

closure with an adverse social impact."

that the grant will enable the hall to continue to be a venue for the club's social activities.

Landfill Communities Fund

LOs are able to claim a credit (currently 5.1%) against their landfill tax liability for 90% of the contributions they make.
